The system must have at least one language and the ID of that language must be specified in the SCRIPT_DEFAULT_LANGUAGE variable of the file /include/constants.php. Such language will be considered as the default language of the system.

A language has a Name and a Folder. This folder name is used to create the language translation files (termed as pages) and language images.

Creating or editing a language is very simple:

Update Language

Folder : *

Active :

Apply Save Close Refresh

You only have to provide a Language name and a Folder name. But you only have to make sure that the Folder name is unique.

You can de-activate a language by changing its status to Inactive and then the language

Editing Language Translations:

To edit language translations, just click the "Pages" icon of the related language and then you will be taken to a listing like this:

This page displays a list of files that are editable. Each file has translations editable in it for that relevant page.

You can also edit these files if you are interested in changing the content of the pages. Like About US page, Terms & Conditions page etc.

Just click on the **aboutus.php** and then edit its contents in the next screen, similarly repeat this process for other files like **terms.php**, **privacy_policy.php**

NOTE:

If you are creating a new language and are translating your site from English in that case first edit files constants.php, constants-commons.php and constants-messages.php.

The common language phrases that are common in many pages are placed in files constants.php, constants-commons.php and constants-messages.php.

It is recommended that these files are edited first.

When you click a file, you will see a list of variables editable:

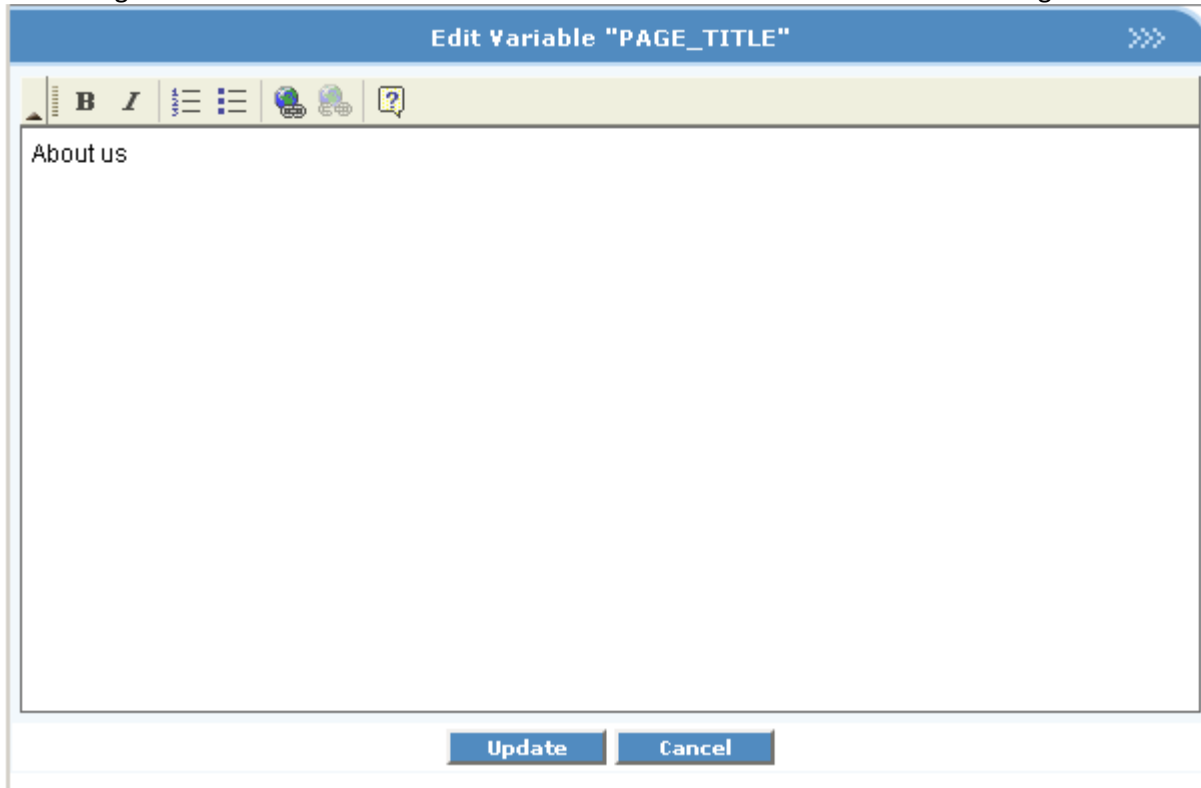

Just change the text in the text boxes or use the HTML link to load rich editor for editing the html:



Once you save all the constants, the language translations will be updated.

Editing Language Images:

You can also change the images on the public site to show different text in different languages, just click the Images button for a language and you will see a list of editable images:

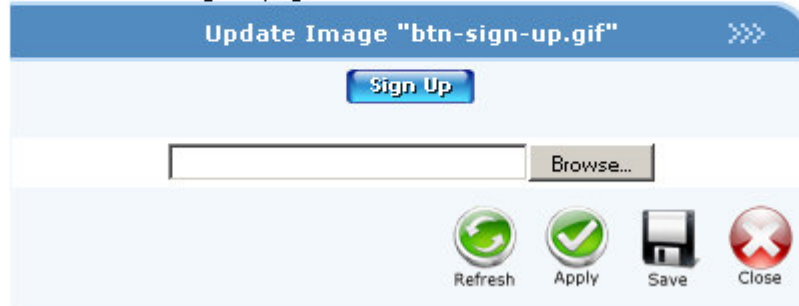


Select an image file:

Update English Image btn-sign-up.gif

You will see the image, just right click and download the file. Then edit it in any image editor to change the text, then upload the image file back using the form. This way you can translate all the texts on images for a language.

Important Note: Before you edit the language files and images, you should make sure that the folders /lang/* and /images/<all_language_folders> must have write permissions (chmod 666).
